The Village at Mitchell Ranch

Pasco's western hub is about to get some new spokes, just not as quickly as envisioned.

Construction is scheduled to begin next month on the initial 30-acre phase of Mitchell 54 West, a 330-acre, mixed-use project of up to 800 homes and nearly 1 million square feet of commercial space. It will be on land currently owned by the Mitchell family at the southwest corner of State Road 54 and Little Road.

Pasco County, in its long-range market plan, designated that area as its western hub, essentially the edge of the Trinity-to-Wesley Chapel corridor along State Roads 54 and 56. The county encouraged walkable communities and accommodations for future mass transit in the location.

Another School Rezoning Update

Two years into the debate, little new remained to be said about Pasco County's west-side school attendance zones during a Tuesday public hearing.

Twenty-three residents spoke at the 5 p.m. event – a number perhaps dampened by rain and going-home traffic – with the bulk of them living in the areas most impacted by the proposed changes, Longleaf and Ellington.

Most opposed the superintendent's recommendation that their neighborhoods be reassigned, although a couple expressed pleasure with the programs offered at the schools where they'd be sent.

But regardless of peoples' personal views on the specifics, a common message arose within the comments. They wanted a more comprehensive approach to the district's crowding issues.

Burn Bans Approvals

The Pasco County Board of County Commissioners passed an ordinance on April 11 that will give the county administrator the power to issue burn bans based on recommendations from fire officials.

Previously, getting bans approved took weeks

New process would allow bans to go into effect immediately

Ordinance still needs to be filed with Department of State

Pasco County Fire Rescue Chief Scott Cassin said in the past, getting bans approved has taken weeks.

"It's extremely frustrating, because it was around a year ago in Pasco County we were seeing the effects of the large number of brush fires that we had," Cassin said. "Several of those brush fires were quite large in magnitude. So we needed to do something really, really quick, and we were kind of bound by the meeting schedule."

In the past, it's been up to county commissioners to authorize a ban, and regular meetings are only held twice a month. Cassin said this new process would allow a ban to take effect immediately.

Facility designs, builds machines that check food quality

Company outgrew facility expanded in 2010

Company expects to employ 600 at new facility by summer

"This is huge. I mean, it's creating, overall, almost 700 jobs – good-paying jobs," said Pasco County Commission Chairman Mike Wells. "This is just the start."

The facility designs, builds, and services machines used by companies to check food quality.

"In modern food manufacturing, a lot of equipment is moving around. Stainless steel pieces, once in a while, will fall off," said Mettler Toledo General Manager Viggo Nielsen. "We find that before it gets to the supermarket."

Nielsen said the Hillsborough facility underwent a major expansion in 2010 that Mettler Toledo outgrew faster than expected. The company went in search of a 30-acre lot – something Nielsen said wasn't possible to find in Hillsborough County.
